College men 3-0 at Ambassador Classic

The Colby Community College men's basketball team swept the Ambassador Classic Thursday through Saturday, finishing the tournament 3-0 at the Colby Community Building.

The Trojans defeated the Tabor College junior varsity 86-40 Thursday; Colorado Northwestern 72-62 Friday; and Northwest Kansas Technical College 96-95 Friday.

In Thursday's game, Braxton Evans led the Trojans with a game-high 24 points. Seven of his 8 baskets were three-pointers and he also grabbed 4 rebounds, 2 steals and 1 block.

Jeremiah Ingram finished with 15 points, 6 rebounds and 1 block; Terry Starks had 13 points as well as 4 rebounds, 4 steals and 1 block; Cody Sluder scored 9 points, pulled down 8 rebounds and made 1 steal and 1 block; John Clarke had 9 points and 3 rebounds.

Rounding out Colby's scorers were Sage Penner with 6 points, 3 rebounds and 1 block; Marko Kracun with 5 points, 3 rebounds and 2 steals; Dillon Trachsel with 3 points and 1 rebound; and Jamal Jones with 2 points and 3 steals.

The men were 30 of 70 from the field, including 12 three-point baskets, and they made 14 of 23 free throws.

On Friday, Ingram finished with a game-high 19 points along with 4 rebounds and 2 blocks.

Starks and Evans followed with 15 points each with Starks getting 7 rebounds and 4 steals and Evans grabbing 1 rebound.

Clarke scored 11 points and had 4 rebounds and 1 steal; Sluder had 6 points and 2 rebounds; Kris Rolle scored 4 points, pulled down an outstanding 10 rebounds and blocked one shot; and Kracun made one basket and had 3 rebounds and 2 steals.

The Trojans pulled down 41 rebounds and had just 15 personal fouls.

Saturday night, Evans was the leading scorer for Colby again with a team-high 22 points, including 5 three-point field goals.

Starks ended up with 19 points, 2 rebounds and 3 steals; Ingram grabbed 17 points, 4 rebounds, 16 points, 2 rebounds and 1 steal; with one basket and 4 rebounds. and Rolle scored 9 points, pulled down 10 more rebounds ad stole throw line, made 10 three-pointers 88-56 Saturday.
