

Coach Michael Collett, a Brewster High grad and first-year coach, said the boys' hard work on defense paid off with 15 steals. They forced 10 more turnovers for a total of 25.

Seth Smith led the defense with 7 steals and finished with 6 points, 10 rebounds and an assist. On offense, the Titans were led by Michael Schmidt with 18 points, including 6 from the free-throw line. Schmidt also had 4 steals and 4 rebounds.

Daymond Hanley had a good day, scoring 9 points, Collett said, and senior Will Allen did a little bit of everything. He finished with 3 points, 2 assists, 2 steals and 3 rebounds.

On Saturday, the Titans came home with their second victory after beating Healy 50-22. Nate Jorgensen led in scoring with 16 points, sinking 3 of 4 baskets from behind the arc. Allen also put in a nice game with 5 assists and 8 rebounds to go with 4 points. Smith finished with 10 points, 7 rebounds, 2 assists, 2 steals and a blocked shot. Schmidt finished with 6 points, 5 rebounds, 2 assists and 2 steals.

Coach Collett said the Titans are averaging 14 steals per game and forcing their opponent to commit more than 20 turnovers per game. In two games, he said, Smith is averaging 8 points, 8.5 rebounds and 9 steals.

The Titans are holding the Sagebrush Shootout in Brewster this week, with games Tuesday, Friday and Saturday.
