which is generally a good thing.'

Rall said his unit started training in Salina for three weeks in January of last year, and then spent two months training at Camp Shelby in Mississippi.

While they were at Camp Shelby, he said, the guardsmen from the 170th were combined with men from units based in California and New York.

"There was a little of, oh, getting used to everybody," Rall said. "It was a little bit differ-

By the time they went to Ku- Rall said. wait, the group included about 150 soldiers in all. Rall said they had not originally been meant to do port security.

"The whole company did a really good job at the training," he said, "so the battalion commander from New York had them assigned to a harder mis-

Although the unit's deployment was quiet, it was not exactly pleasant.

"Believe it or not, it was a little wet," he said. "It had rained. Pretty much, the rain shut off until I would say the middle of November."

Ash Shuaiba is an industrial town, he said, and smoke from factories mixed with dust storms, keeping the sky hazy most of the time. Rall said temperatures were about 120 degrees.

"I may not be right, but it sure felt like it," he said.

War, but not the first one for Rall. He went to the city of Mosul in northern Iraq in 2006 as part of the 714th Security Force.

"It was a lot more exciting,"

By exciting, he added, he meant that the unit was hit with explosive devices, small-arms fire, mortars and other weapons. Unlike the deployment in Kuwait, men were wounded and several were killed.

The unit was there during the troop surge, Rall said, "and it kind of seemed like stuff got moved out of the south and got pushed up over here."

They were first stationed on the outskirts of Mosul, he said, but later moved to a base far away from any cities.

"I can't even begin to spell it," he said of the base's name, adding that it was known simply as Key West."

Since the land around Key West was flat, he said, insurgents could not get close enough to fire mortars at the base. But the unit still had to watch for hidden explosives.

This was the first deployment Coming home from Kuwait nate unit in Colby. of the 170th since the first Gulf was a much easier experience

for him than coming back from Iraq, Rall added.

"When you were on the road," he said, "your senses were always heightened."

Middle School Principal Robb Ross said the school had a going-away ceremony for Rall last year in the gym, with the band playing, and the students wrote him Christmas cards while he was overseas.

"The kids have been very supportive," Ross said. "They're glad he's back."

Born and raised in Colby, Rall, 46, said he has lived here for 39 years between serving on deployments and military train-

He first joined the military in 1986 and was in the Navy for four years. In 1993, he joined the Army as part of a program to help him pay for classes at Colby Community College and was stationed at Fort Riley from 1993 to 2005.

The 170th is part of the 287th Special Troop Battalion, based in Hays. The unit has headquarters in Norton, with a subordi-
