# City OKs bike tour to sleep in park

the city had skeleton crews for snow plowing. Sand dropped on the roads was blowing around and melting snow, which then froze and made the roads worse, he said, but the city got only two complaints.

Councilman Tim Hutfles said that the state appeared to do a better job plowing highways than the city did on streets because state crews put salt on the roads beforehand. He suggested hiring the state to work on city streets. Weber said that comparing how fast state highways and city streets are plowed is difficult.

- Authorized the police and fire departments to seek bids for vehicles. Police Chief Randy Jones said the department wants to replace two 2009 Ford Crown

Victoria police cruisers. Fire Chief Bob McLemore wants to replace a 2004 Avalanche four-wheel-drive which the department uses as the on-call officer's vehicle.

- Approved a resolution to adopt procedures keeping the city in compliance with federal regulations when it handles bond issues, which McGreer said the city needed to do to avoid problems when it issues bonds.

Zerr said the procedures are designed to keep the city in compliance with regulations of Securities and Exchange Commission and the Internal Revenue Service, in case either agency audits the city. The subject has been brought up over the last year at monthly meetings of the Kansas Municipal Energy Association, she said.

"It's something that I learned

about at a KMEA meeting and something that we should be doing already," she added. City Attorney John Gatz agreed that the measures should be adopted.

- Tabled a discussion on updating bids to seal cracks on the airport runways. McGreer said he had been asked by the airport board to look into having the city crew seal the cracks, but the Kansas Department of Transportation would still need to approve the project, since it will pay 75 percent of the costs.

"I wouldn't feel comfortable recommending either," he said.

- Heard Councilman Dave Voss ask how negotiations where going for renting out office space at the airport to SPH Farm. He said that he would only go along with the lease if the use was related to airport business.

Airport Manager Mark Ostmeyer said later that the farm was considering using aircraft for field imaging. He added that he's not sure if the office space will be rented only for airport business, in which case it will need to be rented at a market price.

"It just makes sense to do as far as I'm concerned," he said. "The office space is readily available."

- Discussed a project to change utility meters. McGreer said the city has 23 water meters left to change. Weber said later that the city will change out the last 20 water meters and two electrical meters will be changed out by Johnson Controls Inc., the contractor for the project. The entire project should be done in about a month, he said.

# Kansas 1st District congressman gets earful at meeting

regularly with less conservative governors and legislative leaders before he was elected to represent the sprawling, rural 1st Congressional District of western and central Kansas, as far back

as his first run for public office nearly two decades ago.

Some of his congressional constituents appreciate his bluntness and his harsh criticism of the deal that kept the federal government from going over the so-called "fiscal cliff." Some

also want him to keep being a thorn in the side of Boehner and other GOP leaders.

But at least a few are like Tom Seigler, the carpenter and political independent from the tiny Chase County town of Elmdale who confronted Huelskamp at

the town hall inside the courthouse in Cottonwood Falls. He came to challenge not only Huelskamp's conservative views but even the facts the congressman presented in a chart about the federal debt.

Huelskamp shrugs off criti-

cism, confident that he's voting as most of his constituents want. His district is safely Republican, and the state GOP has moved to the right over the past decade. He had no opposition in his bid last year for a second term in Congress.
