College trustees approve program to purchase car

needed to make a commitment in December.

"Part of that was timing because we were also waiting on the state to tell us if we could do that," Vacik said, "because in the past, they had not allowed us to do that."

Kaaz told Herschberger he didn't want him to think that this was standard practice. Herschberger said he understands the predicament they were in, but still thinks it'll look bad on the college's part when it comes out in the minutes and the college didn't ask for bids.

Gatz said the policy says a purchase like this, meaning the purchase of goods under \$20,000, allows for the president to sign off on it without the board's approval. However, he added, the policy also says the board may request bids for expenses under \$20,000 when doing so might benefit the college.

Trustee Bill Shields said he agreed with Herschberger, say-

ing that with the college asking the community to help it more and more, the college needs to give back to the community, too, and give them its business.

"Give them the opportunity, the first right of refusal, not to bid," Shields said. "At least you're covered and out the door."

Herschberger said he was going to vote to approve this purchase, but just wanted to give his input for future items like this. A motion was made and passed unanimously.

In other business, the board:

- Approved the resignations of Joyce Washburn, dean of academic affairs; Jim Latoski, livestock judging coach; Bob Selby, business instructor; and Reesa Stoll, resource and referral infant toddler specialist.

- Tabled campus dining service bids from Chartwells Higher Education Dining Services and Great Western Dining Service Inc. after the trustees couldn't agree on which one to go with.

Vacik and the administration recommended changing from Chartwells to Great Western. A couple of the trustees had reviewed both contracts and gave their opinion about which service to go with. However, after a motion was made to go with Great Western, the vote was split 3-3. Trustees Nick Wells, Black and Herschberger wanted to stay with Chartwells while trustees Kenton Krehbiel, Arlen Leiker and Bill Shields voted to change to Great Western.

The board tabled the item until they got some answers from both companies and revisited it toward the end of the meeting. Dr. Keegan Nichols, vice president of student affairs and marketing, told the trustees what each representative said about their questions, but the trustees still couldn't agree. They tabled the item again, deciding to hold a special meeting in the next couple of weeks so the trustees could question each representative in person.

County to hold off jail study

a proposal about their recommendations on a site and give an idea on the building's general layout.

"If we want to find out what the people think, we should ask them instead of paying a firm to find out for us. If the local group is willing, I'd bring a contract for review to our next meeting."

Thomas County Attorney Kevin Berens gave a recommendation that the local group should have expertise in building a jail before action is taken.

"I'd have a problem with this suggestion if they can't provide the same service as the professional company can," he said.

Steele assured Berens the group has "some experience."

The contract, explained Commissioner Mike Baughn, provides the ability to terminate services after a feasibility study is conducted. In addition to the study, the contract includes an 8.3 percent fee for design and general contractor services. That means that on an estimated \$3 million project, the county would have to pay an additional \$250,000 on administrative costs, said Steele.

"Although, we could still hold the contract as a possibility for later on, if needed," Baughn added.

Commissioners unanimously approved Steele to be the "point man" and determine the local scope of action. The contract will not be executed at this time.

Lawmakers discuss gun law changes

TOPEKA (AP) — Some law enforcement groups are not happy with a proposal to drop antique guns from the definition of firearms, as part of a bill to change Kansas' firearms regulations.

Assistant attorney general C.W. Klebe discussed the proposed changes Wednesday before a Senate committee.

The *Topeka Capital-Journal* reports (bit.ly/YpxREb) new regulations would clarify that local governments can't bar concealed-carry license

holders from bringing guns into their jurisdictions. One lawmaker questioned if the state couldn't require out-of-state visitors to follow Kansas laws.

Another change would remove older guns such as matchlock, flintlock or muzzle loader rifles from the definition of firearms.

Former Topeka police chief Ed Klumpp, says law enforcement agencies are concerned about how changing the definition of firearms might impact such crimes as selling a firearm to a felon.
