Awake to new ways of worship

How do you connect to God? Is there something you do or like that helps you connect? A certain song, a biblical passage, meditation, prayer?

Whatever it is, I hope you are able to achieve this strong, close connection to God.

Often when one thinks about worship, music comes to mind. Our religious culture often associates formal worship with music. Have you ever thought we may put too much emphasis on music?

Matt Redman, a songwriter in England, composed a song called "Heart of Worship," which centers on this. He speaks of taking away all the "music" and says what you have left is you, the worshipper.

One of the greatest parts of the Bible is in the Old Testament about the various sacrifices. They were personal to the worshiper, all about worship of some type.

Those which pertained to the worshiper's sin allowed that person to reconnect with God. One of these was that the worshiper killed their own animal. Imagine having to kill one of your own. Not take it to someone else to kill, but kill it yourself. This was all without music. Worship was just that connection between you and God.

When it comes to worship, it may or may not include music. However, that may be a way for you to get in touch with God. I eniov songs that lift me up, cause me to become closer to God. I cannot help but sing when they come on the radio. When I hear them in worship, I can deeply connect with him.

Something else that may bring us closer to him in worship is scripture. Because we are all different, we use various scriptures to become closer, including popular ones like Jeremiah 29:11, Philippians 4:13, John 3:16, Psalm 23, Psalm 119:105 and Matthew 19:26. No matter what scripture causes you to connect with him


