is enrolled in two classes – history 1865 to present taught by Tom Moorhous and art history taught by Rebel Jay.

In addition to taking the aquatic exercise class for years, she has been enrolled in at least one course each semester (with the exception of three) since returning to Colby in 1972.

She and Cleo have three children. Colleen Maison is an administrative assistant at the college. Colin is a retired AT&T engineer living in Phoenix. C. Wayne is a retired lawyer in Houston.

Coach Steve Lampe is one of the most honored and respected wrestling coaches in the nation. His tenure at Colby Community College began in 1975 and he retired in 2010.

His list of accomplishments is impressive. He coached 87 All Americans, among them 19 national champions. Fourteen placed second, 14 were third and 10 finished in fourth place.

His teams recorded 305 wins in dual meets. In 1999, the Colby squad won the national championship and in 2000 and 2003 his teams were the national runner-up. His teams finished in the top six in the nation 13 times.

Lampe has earned numerous accolades throughout his coaching career including National Junior College Athletic Association Hall of Fame inductee in 1984 and 1990; Lifetime Service to Wrestling award from the National Wrestling Hall of Fame in 2003; West Region Coach of the Year nine times; national Man of the Year in 1998; National Coach of the Year 1984 and 2000;

Man of the Year 1997-98; Kansas Wrestling Coaches Hall of Fame inductee 1999; three-time recipient of the National Wrestling Coaches Association Bob Bubb Coaching Excellence Award; and he was nominated for wrestling's highest honor – Distinguished Member Hall of Fame in 2009.

He also has been recognized for his teaching excellence. In 2000, he was chosen to receive the college's Teacher of the Year Tangeman Award, and he received the Kansas National Education Association Colby Chapter Teacher of the Year award in 2008.

Coach Lampe was a standout wrestler at Iowa State University, and was an All-American in 1969. Iowa State won the NCAA Championship in 1969 and 1970 and was the runner-up in 1971. He was a three-time Kansas State wrestling champion at Colby High School.

Coach Lampe recruited and coached Daniel Cormier, a two-time Olympian. Five Colby wrestlers have been inducted into the National Hall of Fame and five others are likely candidates. He coached nine NCAA Division I All-Americans and had six national champion academic teams. In 2009, his team had the highest grade average (3.497) in community college history.

Kay Mannebach Estes is one of the best athletes to compete for the Trojans. She was recruited by Cross Country and Track Coach Kirk Hunter and attended the college from 1993-95 after graduating from Colby High School.

She was a member of the women's cross country and track teams. Estes was selected as the junior college Female Athlete of the Year and the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference Athlete of the Year in

1995. She is the only Colby athlete to receive this honor.

Estes earned junior college All American honors in cross country (1993-94), indoor track (1994-95) and outdoor track (1994-95).

Kay is a 12-time All American in cross country (two times) and track (10 times). She won the 1994 Region VI cross country title and finished eighth that year at nationals.

She was the runner-up in the 1,500 meters and third in the 1,000 meters at the 1995 NJCAA Indoor Championships, as well as third in the 1,500 meters and fourth in the 3,000 meters at the national outdoor meet.

She still holds the school record in several categories, including the women's indoor in the 800 meters (2:22.10), 1,000 meters (3:03.20), mile (5:13.59) and distance medley relay (12:33.29). Outdoor records include the 1,500 meters (4:46.90) and the 4x800 meter relay (9:32.28).

Kay was an outstanding student. After graduating, she transferred to Kansas State University, where she was a member of the Wildcat cross country and track teams. She graduated with honors in business administration and accounting.

She and her husband, Jeremie Estes, live in Pratt where they work in the family business, Bucklin Tractor and Implement. The John Deere dealership has locations in Pratt, Bucklin, Greensburg and Ness City. She is the accountant for the business.

Kay is the daughter of Bob and Evelyn Mannebach of Colby. Her in-laws are Debbie Koenig Estes and Kelly Estes of Pratt; Debbie is a native of Colby. The couple has two children, Kyndra, 6, and Kady, 1.

Five people file for school board spots

other meetings in the past.

"I have three children in the school system, so I think it's a very important duty for the future of the school," she said.

Her daughters Taylor, 15, and Madisyn, 12, are in 10th and seventh grades, and her son, Dawsyn, 9, is a third grader. She said she has been the vice president of accounting at Farm Credit since 2004 and a Colby resident since 1994, when she moved from Sharon Springs.

"I came here to go to college and loved the town and have been here ever since," she said.

Until five years ago, Faber's kids have been going to Heartland Christian School where, she said, parents often get the chance to volunteer to keep the school running.

"But in the public school it's harder to get involved," she said, adding that, "I just want to do my service to the community and do my service to the school."

Faber's sons John, 17, and Aaron, 15, are a senior and sophomore at the high school; her son Mark, 13, is in eighth grade and Jack, 3, is not in school yet.

She is a sales director for Mary Kay and her husband, Joshua, teaches fourth grade at the elementary school. Faber said she and her husband grew up around here and moved back to town 13 years ago.

Applebury, the wastewater manager for the city, said that when he noticed there was an opening, "I just wanted to put my name in and get involved."

He said that he has talked about being on the school board with his wife for about two years. His son Eli, 9, is in fourth grade and his daughter Karyssa, 6, is in kindergarten.

Although he would not be directly involved with kids, Applebury said it would be good to be involved in budgeting and other work the board does. As manager for the wastewater plant, Applebury said he does the day-to-day managing for the wastewater budget.

"Well I'm just interested in making a difference in the community," he said. "That's just a good way to do it."

Applebury first moved to Colby when he was in grade school, then went to Wyoming Technical Institute to study automotive technology. He moved back

here in 2002 and was a delivery driver and salesman for Pepsi and Coors before becoming the manager for the wastewater plant in February 2007.

No turnover is expected on the Brewster School Board. Ed Ackerman, Stuart Schmidt and Nicolas Schroeder all filed again for their expiring terms.

Out of four board members whose terms are up at Golden Plains, two will pass their seats off to new people. Matt Cheney and Todd Scharz both filed again for the board, but Terry Moss and Teri Brantley did not. Filing to run for their seats are newcomers Chad Focke and Sandra Lobato.

The Grinnell School District has five people running for three open seats.

Incumbents Duane Volbracht and Loren Stephens are both running again, joined by Melissa Shupe, Brian Beckman and Tanya Becker. The last board member, Marcie Wolf, did not file again.

Two school districts, Oakley and Triplains, did not have enough candidates filing to fill their boards.

In Oakley, one of the three outgoing members, Scott Mau-

rath, said he would not run again. Debbie Runnels and Anita Gabel, the other two members whose terms will expire, both filed.

Superintendent Bill Steiner said his district contacted the Kansas Association of School Boards last Wednesday to find out what to do about it. "I've never had that happen before, so I wasn't sure either," Steiner said.

The association said the board should go through the election as usual. The write-in candidate with the most votes would be asked to join the board, and then those with the next highest number would be asked to join.

If no write-in candidates took the job by the time the term started July 1, a notice will be posted in the newspaper to ask for a candidate to join for a two-year term.

In Triplains, the school board terms for Mark Hanson, Shawn Plummer, Molly Lamb and Dathan Nichols all are expiring, but only Hanson and Plummer filed. Superintendent Lamar Bergsten said the district would rely on write-in candidates and appoint a member if none of the write-ins agreed to serve.
