

Colby varsity girls continue win streak

The Colby High varsity girls basketball team won its fifth game in row Tuesday, taking down Thomas More Prep-Marian 57-45 in front of a home crowd at the Community Building.

The Lady Eagles (13-5 overall, 7-2 Great West Activities Conference) had a hot start and got off to a 21-12 lead at the end of the first quarter.

Colby's scoring slowed somewhat in the second, but the girls still outscored the Lady Monarchs 13-7. The Colby girls went into halftime with a 34-19 lead.

The Lady Monarchs picked up their game in the third, putting in 10 points to Colby's 7.

Both teams scored 16 in the fourth quarter, but Colby got the win 57-45.

Senior Lauren Bell tied for a game-high 15 points, all from three-point baskets. She added 5 rebounds.

Senior McKenna Ortner followed with 11 points, 5 rebounds and 2 assists; junior Haileigh Shull finished with 10 points, 6 rebounds and 3 steals; senior Kenzie Curry had 6 points off of 2 three-pointers, 2 rebonds, 3 assists and 2 steals;

Senior Karly Kriss chipped in 4 points, 5 rebounds and 3 assists; freshman Lara Stephens contributed 4 points and 3 rebounds; and freshman Brenly Terrell had 4 points, a rebound and an assist.

The Colby girls were 6 of 8 from the free-throw line (75 percent), pulled down 32 total rebounds and scored 27 points from three-point shots.

The Colby boys led Thomas More Prep on Tuesday, but came up short in the fourth quarter and lost 51-47.

The Eagles (6-14, 4-6) outscored the Monarchs in day at the high school gym against Larned.

The Eagles' offense slowed down after the break, but they still outscored the Monarchs 8-5 to stay on top, 36-29.



Senior Todd Kane led the scoring with a gamehigh 19 points, making 8 of 15 field goals. He also had 10 rebounds, a block and a steal.

Junior Marc Bremenkamp fouled out with 14 points, including 4 of 6 free throws, 7 rebounds and 3 steals; senior Zane Winger finished with 5 points, 4 rebounds, an assist and a steal; senior Wiatt Binder chipped in 4 points and 2 rebounds; sophomore Josh Matchell made a single three-pointer; and junior Luke Cox made one basket and grabbed 5 rebounds and a steal.

The Colby boys pulled down 40 total rebounds and scored 17 points off the bench.
