
Alley-oop

Colby boys team falls to Pratt in semifinals

The Colby High varsity boys ended their basketball season Thursday, falling 60-39 to Ulysses in the substate semifinals in Pratt.

The Eagles (7-15 overall, 4-6 Great West Activities Conference) committed 19 turnovers, giving Ulysses the chance to run away with the game early in the first half.

The southwest Kansas team scored the first points with a basket, but Colby junior Marc Bremenkamp answered with a bucket of his own in the first minute. Ulysses made another shot, but again Bremenkamp landed 2 points to tie the game at 4 with 5:20 left in the first

Senior Wiatt Binder made a shot and Ulysses answered right back with a two. Bremenkamp sank another basket, but Ulysses got the upper hand when the Tigers landed 2 field goals and a three-pointer to take the lead 13-8.

During a Ulysses possession, junior Luke Cox began limping and was replaced with senior Daniel Myers. Cox wouldn't return to the game until the third quarter. Bremenkamp put in another shot for Colby, but Ulysses made 18-10 at the end of the first.


