Young goat producers get chance to show off animals at K-state event

Kansas State University will hold its third annual Kansas Junior Meat Goat Producer Day, Saturday, March 23, in Weber Arena in Manhattan.

"The Junior Meat Goat Day is an interactive way for young producers to learn about meat goat production and management practices," said Kristine Clowers, youth livestock coordinator with K-State Research and Extension. "While the program includes information that would be beneficial for youth who show goats in 4-H and other competitions, it's also helpful to anyone who is interested in raising meat goats. This year, participants will learn about selection, nutrition, health and show ring practice."

Registration begins at 8:45 a.m., with the program starting at 9:15 a.m. Presentations will include: market and breeding goat selection; facilities; health and wellness; nutrition; and fitting and showing. A non-competitive

Fewer goats in the U.S.

There are currently 2.86 Million Goats in the U.S.

As of Jan. 1, the total inventory of goats in the United States was 2.86 million head, down 4 percent from 2011.

The breeding goat inventory totaled 2.38 million head, down 4 percent from 2011. Does one year old and older were at 1.78 million head, 3 percent below last year. Market goats and kids

totaled 487,000 head, down 5 percent from 2011.

Meat and all other goats totaled 2.36 million head on Jan. 1, 2012, down 4 percent from 2011. There were 360,000 milk goats, unchanged from Jan. 1, 2011. Angora goats were down 15 percent, at 146,000 head.

JERUSALEM (AP) - Following an Israeli newspaper's scoop, the country's prime minister has "frozen" his ice cream budget.

Benjamin Netanyahu's office said once he was made aware of the state-financed contract issued to purchase ice cream from his favorite Jerusalem parlor he ordered it stopped immediately. Netanyahu called the contract "excessive and unacceptable."

The Israel economic publication "Calcalist" published a list of items on the prime minister's annual expense budget, including \$2,700 for ice cream.

Following the publication, Israelis flocked to the "Metudela" ice cream shop near the prime

minister's residence to check out his alleged favorite flavors: pistachio and vanilla.
