The Golden Plains High School boys basketball team played their final game of the season at the substate tournament on Feb. 26 at the Colby Community Building.

The boys faced off against the Weskan Coyotes for the second time this year.

The Bulldogs were a bit rusty to start the game after a nearly two-week layover since their last regular season game was cancelled due to weather. They allowed the Coyotes to jump to a 5-0 lead before getting on the board with a basket from Joseph Koerperich. The Coyotes answered by extending their lead by 7 before the Bulldogs found a rhythm and brought the game back to within 3 before the end of the quarter.

The Bulldogs kept on rolling into the second and brought the game to within 1 point halfway through. They couldn't maintain their momentum, however, as the Coyotes surged forward to lead 32-22 at the half despite a buzzer-beater shot by Grant Spresser.

The 'Dogs kept up the fight well into the third, but few shots fell with only a three from Jose Bermudez and 5 points from Tristan Schwarz, allowing the Coyotes to extend their lead. A dismal fourth included two baskets from Koerperich while the Coyotes powered through for 23 points and the 70-34 win.

Tristan Schwarz finished the game with 17 points. Other 'Dogs on the scoreboard were Koerperich 7, Bermudez 3, Andrew Luna 3, Shane Ryburn 2 and Grant Spresser 2.

This loss finished the Bulldogs' season with a record of 5-16.
