# Museum program follows development of roadways

The Prairie Museum of Art and History in Colby invites the public to a free luncheon along with the *Food for Thought* program, "Converting Pasture Paths to Public Roads" at noon on Thursday, March 21, at the museum.

The final event in this season's monthly series, it will explore the early public road constructions of Kansas. Donations are appreciated.

The president of the Solomon Valley-Highway 24-Heritage Alliance, Joan Nothern, will present this month's program, discussing the early years of the state's roadway system when Kansas farmers cleaned and maintained the roads that crossed their properties.

Nothern will tell how the work and planning by farmers, bankers and town boosters make Kansas

public road construction a dramatic story.

"Roads played a defining role in a town's future," says Nothern. "Location was critical. How these decisions were made is a fascinating part of Kansas history."

As president of the Heritage Alliance, Nothern has coordinated historical research projects, organized symposiums and has helped create 24 interpretive community kiosks. Her interest in sustaining rural Kansas communities has earned her awards from the Kansas Sampler Foundation and the UFM Community Learning Center.

# Patrol offers look at law enforcement

From Sunday to Wednesday, May 12 to May 15, college students interested in a career in law enforcement, particularly with interest in the Kansas Highway Patrol, will have the opportunity to experience what life in the law enforcement world is like.

The Kansas Collegiate Law Enforcement Academy will be held this May at the Kansas Highway Patrol Training Academy.

Criminal Justice programs from community colleges and universities across Kansas work with the patrol to provide this real-world experience. The Collegiate Law program is modeled after a similar program offered to high school students, but designed to bridge the gap between the high school program, criminal justice coursework in college, and obtaining a career in law enforcement.

"It's a great experience that allows students in college the opportunity to see what the KHP is about and if it is the right career choice for those students who believe law enforcement is for them," said Trooper Eric Wheeler, a past Collegiate Law attendee. "Students are able to speak to veteran troopers and get a grasp of what life is like for a trooper, as well as experiences that they have had on the road."

"We had the opportunity to test our skills on the driving range behind the wheel of a patrol car, which is literally our office on a daily basis. We also went to the firing range and used the same firearms used by troopers today. It gives the students the positive reinforcement that they are nearly to that point in their life

of possibly becoming a Kansas state trooper."

Participants go through some of the same training as recruits in the academy, such as search and seizure, law enforcement ethics, team-building, defensive tactics, firearms and driving team.

They also undergo exercises that take them through the firearms range, felony car stops and emergency vehicle operations.

Participating students must be enrolled in a criminal justice program at a Kansas college. They must complete an application packet,

and return it by Monday, April 1. Each participating college must provide a sponsor to accompany students. The cost per student is \$125, which covers training and room and board. There is no fee for sponsors. The student must pass a medical screening.

# Face-tattooed man accused in thefts

GODFREY, Ill. (AP) — Authorities in Madison County are searching out anyone who may have bought things from an alleged burglar of storage units, and they're confident the purchasers will remember the seller.

Adam Roberts, 24, was charged Friday with three felony burglary counts related to thefts discovered last month from as many as 28 storage units in his southwestern Illinois hometown of Godfrey.

What makes Roberts distinctive is the skeleton-style tattoo over his face — artwork that Madison County sheriff's Capt. Mike Dixon calls "just odd."

"It's the oddest thing I've ever seen in 20-plus years of law enforcement," Dixon told the *St. Louis Post-Dispatch*. "I've seen horns on foreheads and stars on necks, but I've never seen a skull on a face."

"I can't explain it."

Authorities say they've recovered \$1,000 worth of stolen property taken in the break-ins. But they suspect Roberts or an accomplice may have sold still-missing items including a black compact refrigerator, televisions, fishing equipment, professional wrestling DVDs, paintings, an antique chest of drawers, an oval mirror and a sewing machine.

"There probably isn't another guy out there with that tattoo, so if they bought something from someone with a skull tattoo in the St. Louis area, it's probably this guy," Dixon said.

Roberts is jailed on \$60,000 bond. Online court records don't show whether he has an attorney.

Deputies ask anyone with information about the thefts or missing items to call the Madison County Sheriff's Department.
