"I cannot do it," Joseph replied to Pharaoh, "but God will give Pharaoh the answer he desires" (Gen. 41:16)

What a resumé Joseph had. Dreamer, interpreter of dreams,

wise, humble. Wisdom came when he worked as a slave for an official of Pharaoh's; the humility came when he unjustly did time in jail. On his resumé, those were his "life experiences." Being a dreamer and interpreter were talents. Standing before the Pharaoh, he tooted God's horn.

"Humility and the fear of the Lord bring wealth and honor and life" (Proverbs 22:4) fit him to a "t." When laid to rest, his resumé included the honor of being the second-most-powerful man in the world and the one who saved much of the known world at the time from starvation.

A worldly proverb goes, "Toot your own horn." Behold the ball player soon after a great play, pounding his chest or doing a little jig for the cameras. Behold the "normal player" tooting his or




