The Colby High boys track team traveled to Mc-Cook, Neb., for its first meet of the season last Thursday, finishing in seventh place with 27 team points.

The other top finishers, all from Nebraska: Mc-Cook first with 173, Lexington, second 118, Cambridge third 83, Holdrege fourth 58, Southern Valley fifth 37 and Dundy County-Stratton sixth with 28.

The varsity Eagles took several medals at the meet. Beau Brown came in second in the 100-meter dash and fourth in the 200 meters, Wiatt Binder fifth in the 3:30 p.m. Friday at Norton High.

200 meters and second in the 400, Josh Brown sixth in the high jump and the 4x100 meter relay team of Adam Giersch, Binder, Josh Brown and Beau Brown took fourth.

Junior varsity boys who scored included: Matthew Pieper took first and Isaac Schweitzer sixth in the 100 meters, Schweitzer first in the 200 meters, Chandler Comfort second in the 110-meter hurdles, Comfort first and Garrett Rose third in the high jump, Pieper first in the long jump and triple jump and the 4x100 relay team of Rose, Schweitzer, Comfort and Pieper placed second.
