Honest search for life's meaning leads ultimately back to Christ

A few years ago, as I read the story of a wellknown '60s activist named Paul McGuire, I felt as though I was being transported back to my own high school days.

That is because, while I was then a new Christian involved in the "Jesus Movement," my best friend's life was running in the opposite direction - almost exactly parallel with that of Paul McGuire.

Paul, who had been raised by atheist parents, thought that Christians were the stupidest people on earth and that their faith was not worthy of even a surface examination. But atheism left him feeling empty and unsatisfied inside.

Like my friend, Paul looked everywhere to find meaning and purpose for his life, but to no avail. His psychotherapist couldn't help him. He read books by Sigmund Freud, Carl Rogers and Carl Jung, but they only confused him. When the "hippie" movement exploded across America and Paul heard Timothy Leary exhort young people to "tune in, turn on and drop out," Paul immersed himself in it all.

Like my friend, he became deeply involved drugs – especially LSD and mescaline. Paul

majored in "altered states of consciousness" in college where one of his professors taught that mental illness and insanity could be the means of entering into a higher consciousness. (Meanwhile my friend was being taught at another university that drugs were both safe and Both Paul and my friend ended their des-

perate search when each finally trusted Jesus Christ to be his own personal Savior. Paul was confronted by "Jesus people," whom he despised; though he noticed that they radiated the glory and love of God. Eventually, a Bible salesman picked Paul

up while he was hitchhiking and explained in Eastern mysticism, and then the occult. Both the gospel to him. Paul prayed to receive Paul and my friend tried to find God through Christ that day, and said later, "Everything I was searching for in mysticism, relationships

and the 'New Age Movement,' I found in Jesus Christ.... He became my Lord and savior, and my new-found relationship with him was clearly real."

My friend was in a park in Albuquerque. N.M., when some "Jesus people" approached him. He was high on LSD, mescaline and peyote. But when they handed him a copy of David Wilkerson's book, "The Cross and the Switchblade," and prayed for him, he fell to his knees weeping, and accepted Christ as his savior and Lord. Immediately, the effects of the drugs left his body and he was a new per-

Jesus said, "Come unto me, all ye that labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest"

Won't you come to Him today? It's as simple as ABC: Admit you are a sinner, Believe Jesus Christ died for your sins and rose from the dead. Confess Jesus Christ as your savior and Lord. There is no true fulfillment except
