roads.

Wilson said the township does not have money to finish fixing the road right away, but that he had the board's approval before he started digging. He said he hopes to have the road fixed in the next few months.

Steele said he noticed more digging than he had in previous visits, and Wilson, who was not present for the commissioners' visit, said he has been gradually digging out the sand and replacing it with dirt.

He uses the sand on other township roads to avoid the costs associated with trucking it in from somewhere else. Since he owns the adjoining land, he said, he plans to keep digging – in his own pasture and in the road – until all the sand is out and replaced

Wilson placed two saw-horse barricades and two cones around the damaged area to warn drivers. Though the barricades are marked as county property, Wilson said the county abandoned them on another project, leaving them in the ditch, so he used them on this wash-out. He stated he would give them back if the county asked.

Clair Shrock, Thomas County road supervisor, said Wilson took the barricades from a county project without permission. He said County Attorney Kevin Berens told him not to retrieve

The commissioners had discussed the damaged road at previous meetings and asked Berens to look into ways the commisremove, the township board and

take over operation of the township roads if the road is not fixed

"We want a safe road system, that's all," said Steele.

Berens told the commissioners the township is responsible for its own roads and the county has no authority to step in. If he receives a complaint, he said, he will look into it to determine whether any laws have been broken. If so, he could pursue criminal charges or ouster proceedings, but that would be at his discretion. The commissioners have no authority to force the township board to fix the road, said Berens.

After returning from their inspection, the commissioners approved Commissioners Mike Baughn's motion to declare the condition "unsafe" and recomsioners could legally oust, or mend Berens proceed "as he deems advisable."
