

"He got straight A's all the way through school," she said. "He got one B – I don't remember what class it was – but it was devastating to him."

"We all knew it was possible when he went over there," Rhea said of her son's death, "but I still can't believe he's gone. I know he's in a better place now.

Wingo said Sergeant Rhea was in his third tour overseas, with previous assignments at the U.S. Naval Station in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, and in Iraq, plus stateside active duty at Fort

As a military policeman in Afghanistan, his mission was to train the Afghan Police Force, which he considered vital to the Afghan people. He had earned military honors including a Bronze Star, Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal and Army Achievement Medal. 
