Pre-marriage counseling is one way to prepare for potential problems. Such counseling can help a couple better understand each other's feelings and thoughts, and offers opportunities to explore areas of potential problems and to plan for handling those problems if they occur.

every marriage. But for a couple who truly care for each other and wish to stay together, professional counseling can help partners sortout those long-standing disagreements and discover ways to cope with problems in a healthy way. Seeking help for a marriage

is not a sign of weakness, nor a signal that a marriage is going to end. Instead, in many cases it is the beginning of building a strong. healthy and long-lasting relation-
