
The Imca Sunoco Hobby Stocks started with several cautions, but

Track squad takes 8th College runners 1, 2

in the 10,000 meters

The Colby Community College men's track and field team finished eighth in the final team standing at the National Junior College Outdoor Track and Field Championships in Hutchinson with 38 points.

The Trojans had 14 athletes compete at the championship, led by the duo of Juan Pacheco and Peter Koskey. Pacheco and Koskey began by finishing first and second place in the men's 10,000 meter run May 16 as Colby ended day one leading in the team standings with 18 points.

"It was exciting starting with a national champion and runner-up and to know you're leading the national meet," said Coach James Ortiz, "but we knew there were plenty of events remaining."

On day two, Koskey finished fourth in the men's 3,000-meter Steeplechase. The men's 4x800 meter relay team, Gabriel Johnson, Ashley Riley, Robert Monticone and Josh Quiroga, finished sixth, breaking the school record for the event. Gennard Paul also finished eighth in the men's javelin as the Trojans ended day two in a tie for third.

On the final day, Pacheco and Koskey stepped up again and finished third and fourth in the men's 5,000 meter run as the Colby men finished eighth in the final standings.

"Our team is built to score in the early events," Ortiz said. "We knew we had to hold on to our spot as long as we could. We had our ups and downs but these guys did a great job of fighting all three days.'

The eighth marks the best outdoor team finish in the college's Division I history. The previous best for the Trojans was last season, when the men took 10th with 30 points. The Trojan men finished the 2012-13 year with top-10 national finishes in all four running sports - cross country, fourth; half marathon, sixth; indoor track and field, 10th; and outdoor track and field, eighth.
