Testing inconclusive

Smith when, only weeks after the Kansas killings, a Florida family was murdered. Cliff Walker and his wife, Christine, along with their two small children, were killed in their home in Osprey, Fla., south of Sarasota. The case was never solved.

Investigators believed that Hickock and Smith fled to Florida after killing the Clutter family, then traveled to Las Vegas where they were captured. They were cleared of the Walker murders by a lie detector test — but in 1987, a polygraph expert declared that such tests were worthless in the 1960s. Christine Walker also had been raped, so Florida authorities sought a comparison to a DNA profile from semen on her clothing to the DNA profiles taken from the remains of Hickock and Smith.

The convicted murderers were buried in a cemetery in Lansing, near the state prison in Kansas where they were hanged. Kan-

sas officials had their remains exhumed in December so state investigators could collect bone fragments for DNA samples.

Kyle Smith said the KBI will eventually turn over results of the DNA tests to Florida officials who will announce any links between the cases.

"In Cold Blood" alludes to the Walker killings in a short passage; Capote incorrectly states that the murders occurred near Tallahassee, Fla., about five hours north of the actual scene. He also relates a conversation between Hickock and Smith on a beach in Miami, and has Smith speculating that "a lunatic" copied the Kansas killings.

Authorities in Florida have said Hickock and Smith were spotted at least a dozen times from Tallahassee to Miami, and in between. On the day of the Walker murders, authorities have said, Hickock and Smith bought items at a Sarasota department store.

Trustees renew president's contract

vice president of student affairs at Fort Hays State University.

She was then hired as a coordinator for Title IX training, but no dollar amount was entered for her salary. She said she will teach an online class on Title IX, the section of the federal education act that requires equal treatment of men and women athletes and covers sexual harassment.

In other business, the board:

- Approved part-time contracts for 35 employees, mostly instructors, and approved adjusted salary amounts for four who were hired last month.
- Heard reports from administrators:
- Dr. Nichols, who was not at the meeting, left a report from herself and other staff. Nichols herself reported that a Title IX training is being given to some faculty and staff to increase the number of investigators trained to deal with discrimination cases at the college. It will last through the summer.

The report said the college made 40 visits to high schools in April, traveling 3,225 miles during three visits to Nebraska last month. Enrollment days will be June 3, June 24, July 15, all of which are Mondays, and Saturday, July 27. In student aid, the school disbursed \$35,197 in federal grants, \$11,042 in its own money and \$148,607 in Stafford, Plus and Perkins Loan funds. There are 240 students in the college residence halls and there should be 13 over the summer. On campus, there was one burglary report, four drug-abuse arrests and five students were arrested in April.

Joyce Washburn, dean of academic affairs, handed out brochures about the coming Kids College. The college will be offering day-long classes to 30 students from fifth through eighth grades over the summer, she said, and had 10 signed up by the time of her report. Washburn also said she is considering trips to Branson, Mo., and India. She said later the trips would be for students and people in the community, and college credit will be available at both.

Barry Kaaz, dean of external affairs, presented a change which the city proposed recently to a walking trail planned around the college. He said city wants to move a section of the

trail along the north side of the campus back 12 feet, which would destroy part of the college's sprinkler system and relocate a light pole.

After some discussion, the trustees approved a proposal to the city to go with the changes if the city will pay for the sprinklers and light pole.

The trustees also approved bids that Kaaz presented to them, including one from Pro-flo to clean the carpets in the dorms for \$3,438, from Construction Solutions out of Colorado to add a new concrete floor covering in Ferguson Hall for \$31,500, a trade-in bid for a new lawnmower from Lang Diesel for \$5,726 and a year-long contract with Kansas Water Technologies for a new anti-freeze treatment to the heating and cooling system, which would include 30 gallons added quarterly for \$1,485 and a filter for \$1,126.

Athletic Director Ryan Sturdy said the men's track team came in eighth in nationals, adding that Juan Pacheco won a national championship and Peter Koskey was a runner up. Antowin Edwards started as the head women's basketball coach and has three or four scholarships left to fill on the team.

Dr. Xuemei Yang, dean of institutional effectiveness, reported she was working on a strategic plan and getting results from a survey for recent graduates, which Vacik said will be ready for the next meeting.

Brooks Wederski, computer center director, said the college will be getting new technology equipment and working on projects for the computer labs over the summer.

Public Information Director Debbie Schwanke said she got a note from Dr. Richard Mosier, the college's first president, thanking the college for letting him be the speaker for this year's commencement. Schwanke remarked that she thought sponsoring the kids' fishing derby was one of the best things the college did for the community.

Trustee Nick Wells, endowment foundation director, said that \$89,125 will be going to spring scholarships from the foundation scholarship payment. He said another \$54,500 is going to the college's recovery fund, to rebuild the college reserve fund, that came from the recent endowment auction.
