Arizona proof law illegal

WASHINGTON (AP) – The Supreme Court ruled today that states cannot on their own require would-be voters to prove

easier. The justices voted 7-2 to throw out Arizona's voter-approved requirement that prospective voters document their U.S. citizenship in order to use a registration form produced under the federal "Motor Voter" voter registration law.


