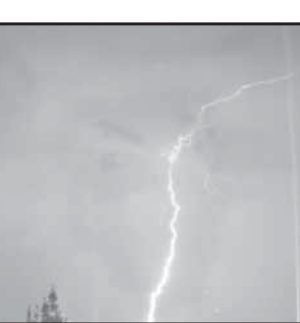


Weather



National Weather Service

Tonight: Showers and thunderstorms likely, mainly before midnight. Some of the storms could be severe and produce heavy rainfall. Mostly cloudy, with a low around 57. East wind 10 to 15 mph decreasing to 5 to 10 mph after midnight. Chance of precipitation is 70 percent.

Tuesday: A 20 percent chance of showers and thunderstorms. Partly sunny, with a high near 83. Southeast wind 5 to 15 mph.

Tuesday Night: A 50 percent chance of showers and thunderstorms. Mostly cloudy, with a low around 63. South wind 10 to 15 mph.

since when it was put in the ground," she said.

There were late freezes on April 9 and 10 and very cold weather for almost a month after that. Thomas County has also seen some very dry conditions since then, she said.

Farmers will get a late start

harvesting their wheat, Falk said. They will probably start working in about two weeks and still be at work on the fourth of July.

Several thunderstorms have rolled through in the past week, but they have not done much to add moisture. The extension center measured 3.84 inches of evaporation so far this month,

but only 1.24 inches of precipitation before this weekend, when an additional .92 inches brought the June total to 2.16 inches, as opposed to the 2.62 inches considered normal for the month. Precipitation came to .37 inches in April and 1.66 in May, and the normals for those months are 1.94 and 3.29.

Arizona proof law illegal

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Supreme Court ruled today that states cannot on their own require would-be voters to prove they are U.S. citizens before using a federal registration system designed to make signing up easier.

The justices voted 7-2 to throw out Arizona's voter-approved requirement that prospective voters document their U.S. citizenship in order to use a registration form produced under the federal "Motor Voter" voter registration law.

Federal law "precludes Ari-

zona from requiring a federal form applicant to submit information beyond that required by the form itself," Justice Antonin Scalia wrote for the court's majority.

The court was considering the legality of Arizona's requirement that prospective voters document their U.S. citizenship in order to use a registration form produced under the federal "motor voter" registration law.

The 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals said that the National Voter Registration Act of 1993, which doesn't require such documentation, trumps Arizona's Proposition 200 passed in 2004.

Arizona appealed that deci-

sion to the Supreme Court.

"Today's decision sends a strong message that states cannot block their citizens from registering to vote by superimposing burdensome paperwork requirements on top of federal law," said Nina Perales, vice president of litigation for the Mexican American Legal Defense and Educational Fund and lead counsel for the voters who challenged Proposition 200.

"The Supreme Court has affirmed that all U.S. citizens have the right to register to vote using the national postcard, regardless of the state in which they live," she said.
