

# Pimento pepper: hot, it's really not

Dear Heloise: I often see pimentos used in recipes and, of course, stuffed in olives, but what exactly are they? - Kevin H., via e-mail

They are little, heart-shaped red peppers! But they are not hot like a chili pepper. They are seeded, peeled, cored and cooked before being diced or sliced and packaged in jars. They have a sweet flavor and can be added to salads (potato and coleslaw are favorites), sandwiches and, of course, cheese. The "pimento" in olives is made from the same red pepper, but is processed into uniform pieces. One of my favorite recipes that uses pimentos

is my mother's (the original Heloise, 1919-1977) Heloise's Pimento Cheese Spread. To make it, you need the following ingredients: 1 pound boxed soft cheese (or any style cheese

- that can be grated)
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup finely chopped pickles (your favorite kind)
- 4 ounces pimentos

Grate the cheese (if necessary) using a food processor or the large side of a cheese grater. Place a large piece of plastic wrap or wax paper on the counter. Now you are going to layer your ingredients, starting with the grated cheese/soft cheese, followed by the mayonnaise, pimentos and pickles. Use a spatula to fold the ingredients over and over from the bottom to the top. Repeat the process until all the ingredients are gone. Next, store the spread in jars, making sure they are sealed tight, and place in the refrigerator.

Box 795001, San Antonio, TX 78279-5001. Keep a jar of pimentos in the pantry to add to egg salad, deviled eggs, potato salad or a side salad. They add a touch of "red" to the plate. - Heloise

#### **MORE GRAVY**

Dear Heloise: When making gravy (from drippings) and you need a larger amount, add some similar store-bought gravy to yours (beef, turkey, etc.). The amount added depends on the amount needed and the flavor you want. I can at least double the amount of "homemade" gravy I need. Alice L. in New York

#### **OVEN SPILLS**

Dear Heloise: To remove oven drips or spills more easily, carefully sprinkle salt on the spots as soon as possible and while they are still hot. After XVXHRSYBO DGPVU HZGLSLVT they cool, they usually can be popped off. – N.R. in Pennsylvania

If the spill is stubborn and doesn't come off easily, then once the oven cools, remove the spill with a sturdy brush or plastic spatula (not a metal spatula, which may scrape the oven surface coat-



# **A Rare Finesse**

The "backward" finesse is a play that is rarely used because it is much less likely to succeed than an ordinary finesse. However, when a backward finesse offers the only realistic chance to make the contract, it must be risked.

Consider this deal where South gets to four hearts as shown and West leads the K-Q-A of diamonds. Declarer ruffs the third diamond and forces out the ace of hearts. South wins East's trump return and, having already lost three tricks, must avoid a spade loser.

With this spade combination, declarer would normally lead to the ace and then back to the jack, hoping East had the queen. This would win about half the time.


In this deal, though, declarer knows from the bidding that the normal spade finesse is doomed to fail. East has already shown up with the ace of hearts and presumably would not have passed his partner's opening bid if he also held the queen of spades. Furthermore, West would not have enough points for an opening bid without th spade queen. Fortunately, South has the necessary spot card

in spades to make a backward finesse feasible. S he initiates the suit by leading the jack from hi hand. If West ducks, the jack is allowed to ride and the contract is home. If West covers the jack with the queen, dum

my wins with the ace and a spade is returned to ward the K-9. After East follows low, the nin is played, and, because East has the ten, again declarer is home. When the location of a missing queen is no


known, a backward finesse in that suit will suc ceed only 25 percent of the time, since it depend on two cards -- the queen and ten -- being favor ably placed. For this reason, the play is seldon used. But when the usual approach seems certain to fail, the backward finesse might offer the only hope.
