# Walker acts to remember

Afghanistan, one of the most recent additions to the banner. The post had a memorial service for him June 23 at the Legion Hall.

Patrick met Rhea's mother, and said later she was one of about 15 mothers of servicemen killed during the war he has met on the walk. He showed the group a picture of Derrick J. Lutters, who lived in Burlington and Goodland.

"I have stories that are more compelling," Patrick said, adding that Lutters is one of four service members whose story he tells to people he meets across the country. Patrick, a Special Olympics coordinator and coach, related the story that, when in high school, Lutters deliberately lost a wrestling match with a "special needs" kid to make his opponent feel better.

No one at the Legion had ever heard that story, but Jim Vap, post adjutant, said he served with Lutters in the national guard's 170th Maintenance Company in 2000 and 2001, and said the young man had volunteered to go to Iraq.

Patrick said he put almost two years of research into making the banner, a piece of cloth about seven feet wide covered with pictures of war casualties about a square inch in size. There are 6,688 of them on the banner, he said, 74 from Kansas.

The display was left hanging at the post that weekend, then Patrick finished most of the 33mile walk to Hoxie on Monday. By Tuesday morning, he was covering ground just east of hauling his banner and gear - meets sign it. about 30 pounds in all – stuffed in an army backpack.
