

Science facts abound in the Bible

I have been a pastor for more than 30 years. That means many sermons preached and Bible studies led. If the Bible was just any book, it would have become boring to me. Instead, the Bible just keeps getting more exciting as I learn new things.

One subject that is relatively new to me has to do with scientific facts that are simply stated in the Bible, only to be "discovered" by scientists many centuries later. Some of these scientists have even received Nobel Prizes for their discoveries. I have only limited space here to point these out, but let's look at a few of these scientific facts in the Bible. (I'll tell you where to find more at the end of the article.)

I had read a few biographies of Christopher Columbus, so I already knew he had based his conviction that the earth was a sphere upon what the prophet Isaiah had written 2,000 years earlier, in Isaiah 40:22, that God "sitteth upon the circle of the earth..." 


