## Ex-Trojan starting in Big 12

Former Colby Community College player Elzbieta Klein will be a big part of West Virginia University's quest to climb the Big 12 volleyball standings this fall.

Last season, the 6'2" Klein was West Virginia's leading hitter during seven different matches. She also delivered 10 kills or more on seven occasions, including a 14-kill/11 dig effort against Texas Tech on Oct. 13.

Overall, the Trojan alum drilled 165 kills for fourth on West Virginia's team. She also totaled 98 digs, 15 total blocks and 13 ace serves. She served three aces against Pittsburgh, Pa.-based Dusquesne University on Oct. 6.

Klein achieved all these highlights during her first season with the NCAA Division program playing its first year against Big 12 Conference competition.

However, the Mountaineers didn't fare well with an 0-16 Big 12 record.

Klein was an all-region and allconference player for Colby College in 2011-12. She ranked No. 5 nationally among all National Junior College Division I players with over four kills per match.
