





Blind dog needs help navigating

Dear Heloise: My dog recently went blind, and our family had some adjusting to do. I wanted to share a few hints with you and your readers that might help someone else who's going through We talk to our dog a lot more now. We want

him to know that we are in the room and that he isn't alone. Always make sure you talk to pets before touching them so you don't scare them when they aren't expecting it.

Leave the furniture where it is. He has learned where the furniture is and can move around it. If you change the location of a piece of furniture, pets could lose their way and bump into it. When he first went blind and was learning his

way, we padded the sharp corners on coffee tables, etc. They sell furniture pads for childproofing that work very well for pets, too. We placed a mat under his food and water

bowls. If he feels the mat, he knows he is close to the bowl and isn't searching for it and spilling food and water.

Bidding Quiz

1. Pass. Partner's one-heart bid is 100 percent forcing, but you are not obliged to bid after East intervenes with one spade. At this stage there is no way for you to know whether partner's response was based on six, 10 or even more highcard points, nor can you tell what kind of distribution he has. When East enters the auction with one spade,

you are presented with an opportunity to tell partner, by passing, that you have no clear-cut action at this point. Partner has another bid coming after East's overcall, so there is no chance of his being left at the post with a good hand. 2. Four notrump. Partner obviously has a one-

track mind – he likes diamonds. He probably has seven of them to the A-Q-J or something similar, and your best bid under the circumstances is to find out how many aces he has. Accordingly, you bid four notrump (Black-

wood). You plan to pass if partner responds five diamonds, showing one ace; to bid six diamonds if he responds five hearts, showing two aces; and to bid seven diamonds if he responds five spades, showing three aces, even though there is a small risk that the grand slam might fail. 3. Three notrump. It would be wrong to bid


only two notrump, since your first two bids could have been based on only 13 or 14 points. Since you have 17 points and have not yet shown your extra values, you should identify them now by jumping to three notrump. A two-spade bid would be incorrect on two
