"Not to make excuses, but it's hard to practice 100-foot putts. That's how big some of the greens were, and they were really fast," Colby High coach Mark Williams said about the season-opening tournament. "Plus they've gotten a lot of rain there, and that made the roughs really gnarly.'

Yet despite all these obstacles, the Eagles delivered a very respectable season-opening effort. In fact, their team score of 212 at this nine-hole showdown took third among 12 teams competing.
