Eagles sweep pair at Norton

The Holcomb Longhorns rumbled out of Norton High School's gymnasium just in time Tuesday night.

Because once the Colby Eagles got unleashed, no foe from Norton to Hays was safe during this season-opening volleyball quad.

Boom! Senior Karly Shull slammed the clinching kill down against Thomas More Prep-Marian.

Ace! Sophomore Lara Stephens sent a serve sinking perfectly past two tumbling Norton Bluejays!

Tricked! With her back to the net, sophomore Brielle McKee "flipped" a perfect hit over taller but clearly caught-off-guard defenders.

Awesome. Junior Haileigh Shull kept the Eagles soaring whether she was hitting, serving or passing.

"She's finally starting to come out of her shell, I guess could say," Colby head coach Jerry McKee observed.

All done and say good night!

Eagles finished Colby's second two-set sweep.

The Eagles (2-1 record) shook off their opening loss to Holcomb by never losing another set. They downed both Thomas More Prep 25-20, 25-20; and host Norton 25-11, 25-17 in a match that finished just before 10 p.m.

"We had to flip some people in the lineup, just some minor adjustments. Once we did that, it balanced out our attack," coach McKee said. "And we just needed some court time. There were things you don't see when you're scrimmaging each other. Our floor coverage got better and by the end of the night, I felt we evolved into a much higher state of play."

Holcomb's 25-18, 25-10 opening win over Colby secured the quad championship, although Holcomb only played two matches due to scheduling conflicts.

The Longhorns also swept host Norton, which finished 0-2 in this opener.
