Wilma I. Pabst

Wilma I. Pabst, 89, Colby, died today, Friday, Sept. 6, 2013, at Citizens Medical Center in Colby. She was born Oct. 16, 1923, on her grandparents' farm in Thomas County, the daughter of Roy Allen and Effie Leah (Grover) Kistler. Except for a few months in Florida during World War II, she lived in Thomas County all her life. Raised on her grandparents' farm south of Colby, she attended the Olive Branch School and graduated from the Page City High School in 1942. On Oct. 29, 1942, she married Lawrence Comstock Towns in Colby, just before he joined the Navy. Following the war they returned to the farm they had in Summers Township. He preceded her in death in 1963. On July 23, 1966, she married Paul F. Pabst whom she had met while working at the Chief Cafe. They continued working the farm. Preceding her in death were her parents, her first husband in 1963, her second husband in 2001 and a daughter, Laura Hansen in 2006. Survivors include two sons, Leroy Towns, Manhattan, and Larry Towns, Colby; a daughter, Lois Dellere-Struckmeyer, Colby; two brothers, Ernest Kistler and Donald Kistler, both of Colby; nine grandchildren; and 12 great-grandchildren. Services will be at 10:30 a.m. Monday, Sept. 9, 2013, at the Kersenbrock Funeral Chapel in Colby, with Pastor Lyle Knebel officiating and burial in Beulah Cemetery. Visitation will be from 2 to 8 p.m. Sunday at the funeral chapel. Learn to make use of school counselor

As the new school year gets underway, your school age children will be facing a whole new set of opportunities and challenges. While it is common for parents to focus on the school's classroom teachers, there's an important resource that too many parents simply overlook - the school counselor. School counselors are the professionals educated and trained to work with students in terms of human development, relationship issues and the many choices that students have to face, especially in the high school years when career and higher education decisions need to be made. Several states even require a number of years of classroom experience. Many school counselors are not only ex-

perienced classroom teachers, but hold a Masters degree in counseling or a related field. Having well-trained professionals as school counselors helps them understand both the educational process and the developmental stages that children go through. They understand the significant self-concept developmental issues that occur around the age of puberty and early adolescence, and know how to help students facing difficulties at such times. Many parents fail to realize that their school counselor is there to not only help the students, but can also provide assistance to parents facing problems with their child. When you're dealing with your

child's unhappiness with school, the school counselor is the resource you need. An excellent investment for you as a parent is to make an appointment, early in the school year, to meet your child's school counselor and to understand the services he or she can provide. You'll probably find your school counselor's expertise can be a valuable asset in trying to raise a healthy, happy, well-adjusted child.
