CLEAN CHALKBOARD

Dear Heloise: Help! My son accidentally wrote with crayon on his chalkboard. How can I remove it? – Wendy in Alabama

Don't stress, Wendy, help is here! Sprinkle a damp (water only) sponge with some baking soda and scrub the chalkboard. It might take a little elbow grease, but this should remove the crayon marks. While you are at it, give the entire chalkboard a scrub, and it will look brand-new. Rinse and wipe dry. 1. If you were to draw trumps now, the outcome would depend entirely upon winning four spade tricks instead of the three that are in plain view. The probability of finding the spades divided 3-3, or either opponent with the singleton or doubleton jack, is only slightly better than 50 percent.

You can add significantly to your chances by first cashing the A-Q of hearts. If both opponents follow suit, you next play the K-A of spades, then ruff a low spade with a high trump. Now a heart to the king allows you to discard two clubs on the Q-10 of spades, making the contract whether the opposing spades are divided 3-3 or 4-2.

Of course, if the trumps turn out to be divided 4-1 or 5-0, you should finish drawing them at once and stake the outcome on a favorable spade division.


2. This is one of those cases where making the contract is certain regardless of how the opponents' cards are divided. All you need to do is to prepare for the possibility that North might have the king and queen of spades, and that one opponent might have four or more hearts headed by the queen. You start by cashing the A-K of clubs and K-A

of hearts. Next you lead a spade from dummy, planning to play the jack if South follows low. (If South produces the queen or king of spades instead, your worries are over, since you can win with the ace and concede a spade trick.) Let's assume the jack of spades loses to the

king or queen. In that case, North would hand you the contract if he returned either a spade or a club. If he leads a heart instead, he cannot do so without establishing at least one heart trick in dummy, on which you can deposit your other spade loser.
