

# Bulldogs take on high-scoring foe

The Golden Plains Middle School Football team welcomed the boys from Logan-Damar recently for their first home game of the season.

Golden Plains kicked to start the game, and stopped the offense on the goal line before allowing them to make the first touchdown of the game.

Back on offense, A.J. Camacho broke through for a 45-yard run, and the Bulldogs scored a touchdown at 3:05 left in the first quarter to close within 8-6.

The visiting team scored again, but the Bulldogs stopped the extra point attempt, to make the score 14-6 at the end of the first quarter.

Early in the second quarter, Jacob Ritter made a great pass to Jeron Schutte for a touchdown. Then, he passed the ball to Camacho for the extra points and tied the game 14-14.

Just seconds later, Logan-Damar broke through our defense to score a touchdown. The visitors were able to put in more touch-

downs to take a halftime lead of 36-14.

Although the Logan/Damar team scored again in the third, the Bulldogs were determined to continue the battle.

Clayton Bange blocked to open the field up for Camacho, who raced to the end zone for one more touchdown and a 42-20 score.

The visiting team continued to push through Golden Plains' line for a couple of more end zone runs. The Bulldogs did not give up and Jeron Schutte blocked two of Logan-Damar's extra-point kick attempts.

Despite their defensive efforts, the game ended early in the fourth with the Logan-Damar team winning 68-20.

"We played hard," Jacob Ritter said. "As a team we still need to work on communicating better and having better team work."

"The boys had great improvements," coach Russ Aumiller added. "We still need to work on fundamental skills."

The boys have nearly a week to prepare for their next home game against Cheylin on Thursday.

Sophomore Maisy Munson of Anthem, Ariz., was selected as the Week by the Division I Player of the Week by the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference.

Munson was also named the National Junior College Athletic Association Division I Player of the Week.

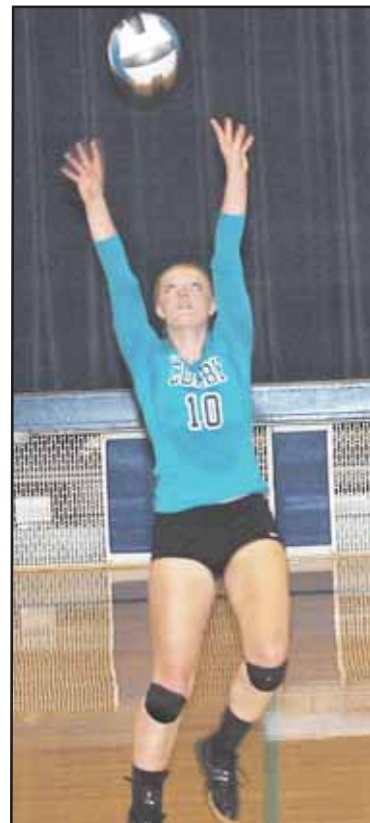
The sophomore setter helped lead the Lady Trojans through the 7-0 run during the first round of Jayhawk Conference play. She posted her fifth and sixth double-doubles of the season last week with two wins against Garden City and Barton.

Munson had 83 assists that week, averaging 11.85 assists per set. She also averaged 3.14 digs per set.

On Wednesday, Munson's 42 assists helped the Trojans improve to 8-0 in Jayhawk play with a three-set sweep of visiting Dodge City Community College.

The Trojans (15-4 record overall) now get ready to visit top league contender Hutchinson Community College Saturday afternoon (2 p.m.) in Hutchinson.

Hutchinson owns a 7-1 league record with that lone loss at the Colby Community Center on
