County jail problems seen

could flood the jail floor, where there are several fans and space heaters hooked up to electrical outlets.

"Somebody's going to get electrocuted sooner or later," he said.

The commissioners did not come to a decision after their discussion about the jail. Earlier in the meeting, they heard a report from Allen Beck, a consultant hired to work on the jail expansion. Beck said he is still going over demographic data from the county, and is getting conflicting data on population trends. The population is going down, he noted, but more apartments are being built.

During the talk about the contraband, the commissioners discussed using pre-fabricated metal pods as a way to house inmates. Baughn said he understood that Beck does not like the idea of pods.

In other business, the commissioners:

- Approved bids for a new pickup and mower

tractor for the landfill. They first voted to approve a bid from Tubbs and Sons Ford for a new pickup for \$22,142. After Landfill Director Larry Jumper studied the bids for a new tractor, the commissioners approved a bid for a \$55,514 New Holland tractor from American Implement.

The commissioners then agreed with Jumper's recommendation to take around 1,100 old railroad ties from Superior Railroad. Jumper said he talked with the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, and learned the landfill might need a permit to grind the ties down, and that they would need to be sampled for creosote. The landfill would get \$41,000 to dispose of the ties.

- Approved a \$2,965 bid from Northwest Decorating Center to replace a carpet in the treasurer's office. County Clerk Shelly Harms said that someone installing a new postage meter dropped ink on the floor, and the company he worked for offered to clean the ink up, but not to replace the carpet.

Deal reached to avoid default

Morning" today that a U.S. government default on its debts would be "much worse than Lehman Brothers," the investment firm whose 2008 collapse led to the global financial crisis. Aides to Reid and McConnell said the two men had resumed talks, including a Tuesday night conversation, and were hopeful about striking an agreement that could pass both houses.

It was expected to mirror a deal the leaders had neared Monday. That agreement was described as extending the debt limit through Feb. 7, immediately reopening the government fully and keeping agencies running until Jan. 15 – leaving lawmakers clashing over the same certain defeat. Working against

him was word during the day from the influential group Heritage Action for America that his legislation was not conservative enough – a worrisome threat for many GOP lawmakers whose biggest electoral fears are of primary challenges from the right. The last of Boehner's two bills had the same dates as the emerging Senate plan on the debt limit and shutdown. But it also blocked federal payments for the president, members of Congress and other officials to help pay for their health care coverage. And it prevented the Obama administration from shifting funds among different accounts – as past Treasury secretaries have done – to let the government keep paying bills briefly after the federal debt limit is reached.

Boehner crafted two versions of the bill, but neither made it to a House vote because both faced certain defeat. Working against him was word during the day
