Robber stops to bum cigarette

AMBRIDGE, Pa. (AP) - A bank robbery suspect was nervous when a construction worker saw him throw his shirt in a trash container on Friday - but not so harried that he didn't stop to bum a cigarette, police said.

Acting Ambridge Police Chief Sgt. James Mann said that Paul Carman, 36, gave a Huntingdon Bank teller a note saying, "This is a robbery. No dye packs. No alarms," about 1:30 p.m. Oct. 4, the *Beaver County Times* (bit.ly/GIDJSi) reports. Carman also apologized to the teller.

Police gave a construction worker and others near the bank a description of the robber, and the worker said that a man matching the description stopped by a moment later and asked for a cigarette. When the suspect was told that police were looking for someone wearing a cap and a blue shirt, Carman allegedly threw those items into a nearby trash container.

Police caught up with him later that day.

AZTEC, N.M. (AP) - Flooding in New Mexico washed up an unexpected item in one small city - a casket.

The *Daily Times* reports (bit.ly/15Lk9xV) that the rusty casket washed up in an arroyo near Aztec Speedway during the recent flooding in northwestern New Mexico.

The casket's appearance mystified Aztec Well Servicing employees, and when an employee opened it he found what he thought were bones.

But Aztec Police Sgt. Joseph Gonzalez said nothing but trash, towels and junk were inside.

Anti-zoning advocate Carl Bannowsky, who lives near where the body-less coffin was found, says he's sure the mysterious casket is his.

He says one of his three caskets washed away during a recent monsoon rain.

Bannowsky says he collects old cars but had purchased the casket at an auction in the 1980s.

3. Services that were not ordered by your doctor.
