BALL GROUND, Ga. (AP) – Police in Georgia are offering a \$1,000 reward for the arrest of whoever stole a scarecrow portraying Uncle Si Robertson from the TV show "Duck Dynasty."  
 The scarecrow, which features the popular character from the reality show wearing camouflage and sitting on a hay bale with his legs crossed, went missing between Wednesday night and Thursday morning in the town of Ball Ground about 50 miles north

of Atlanta.  
 City Clerk Karen Jordan tells the *Cherokee Tribune* (bit.ly/1c9EO3l) that the scarecrow was a favorite in the city's inaugural scarecrow contest.
