The permit was one of 111 up for auction nationwide, and one of two in Kansas. (The other was in the southeast corner of the state.) There was no auctioneer, Vyzourek said, but he had to spend about 10 hours online going through rounds of bidding.

"I mean, this wasn't a regular auction,"

After he bought the construction permit, he said, hired an engineer from Ohio to design his tower. Paperwork about the new station, such as how high the antenna would be, had to be sent to the government to prove it would work. The federal government shutdown earlier this month delayed the return of the final permit, but he hoped to have it by the end of October.

"The feedback's been real positive," he said. "The people I've talked to have been real supportive."

Vyzourek said he and his wife Becca will own the station. He said it will be musicoriented, and that he will research the right tunes to play.

He estimates it will cost \$150,000 to \$200,000 to set up. Among other things, he will have to buy a 1,500-pound transmitter costing \$52,000 to \$80,000. The three-inchthick copper wire that runs from the transmitter to the tower will cost about \$20,000 for 600 to 700 feet.

He and his wife saved up some of the money for the station, Vyzourek said, but most of it will come from a bank loan. Although he will work together with KXXX, his station will not be a part of the Rocking M company. "I've learned more about the industry that

I've been a part of in the last year than, I think, in the last 14," Vyzourek said.


