do electrical work or cover any sudden catastrophe, he said, so the city should keep its insur-

For Colby, the company would take over painting and maintenance for \$139,152 a year for the first five years. After that, it would maintain the tower for \$52,566 a year, Dugger said.

The company offers a oneyear "evergreen agreement," he said, which the city could cancel at any time. The company would be bound to stay in the agreement as long as the city pays its bills.

Dugger explained some issues he found with Colby's 1.5 million-gallon tower after a visit in July. It will need a paint job, he said, which is often one of the most expensive costs for a water tower.

He said a cathode plate, designed to prevent corrosion of the metal tank, had been taken off several years ago, Dugger said, and someone did a poor job of sealing the holes where it had

been attached.

The Kansas Department of water tower to be brought closer to the ground, he added, and a flapper gate to be installed over the end. The roof vent for the tower also needs to be replaced.

City Technology Director Mike Albers said the tower had been painted in the late 1990s or early 2000s. The cathode plates kept falling off the tower, he

The most important improvetower would be a water mixer inside the tank. In warm weather, Dugger said, cold well water pumped into the tower from warmer water goes to the top. Cities often get abnormal sample reading at about this time of year, he said, when the water at the top starts to cool down and settle at the bottom.

HUTCHINSON (AP) – The pink labels wrapped around and glued to the pork-packed aluminum cans bore an address: Mennonite Central Committee, Akron, Pennsylvania, USA. But it took men, women and

children and a two-day meatcanning marathon in Reno County to start the canned meat on a journey that likely will end abroad.

In the last fiscal year, Mennonite Central Committee's meat shipments totaled 514,512 cans, benefiting people in need in the U.S. and a dozen foreign countries, the Hutchinson News reported (is.gd/24wfO0). The top five recipients were North Korea, Ukraine, Bosnia, Honduras and Nicaragua.

The 2013-14 meat-canning schedule started in October in Ohio and will conclude in April in Ontario, Canada.

Community churches donated money to purchase pork, said Kevin Knepp, treasurer for the local Mennonite Central Committee canning committee.

Typically, they purchase about 20,000 pounds of meat and volunteers work in three shifts - beginning at 5:30 a.m. to complete the canning in two days. The operation began Monday and wrapped up Tuesday.

The boxes of cans will go to a Mennonite Central Committee warehouse in Harvey County, for eventual distribution to wherever the need is greatest," Knepp said.
