TACO SEASONING

Dear Heloise: You once shared a recipe for taco seasoning. I loved that recipe, but somehow lost it. Could you please reprint it? - K.S. in Nebraska

Sure I can! One nice bonus is this is cheap to make, so why not mix up a big batch and save a bundle of money?

All you need is:

2 teaspoons chili powder

Salt, pepper and onion powder to taste (start-

ing with just a sprinkle) A dash of crushed, dried oregano

Mix together all the ingredients and start using this seasoning on all your favorite foods. I like it best with my Heloise Taco Casserole made with taco shells or corn chips, salsa and ground turkey or shredded chicken cooked in the seasoning for Use nonstick spray or grease a casserole dish

(you pick the size depending on ingredients you have). Put some salsa on the bottom, then a layer of broken-up taco shells or chips, followed by the cooked, flavored meat. Next, layer with your favorite toppings: beans, cheese, onions, etc.


Bake until heated through and cover with sour cream, olives, lettuce, tomatoes, etc., before serving.
