

Speakers at the event stressed the need to look out for veterans coming home. Legion adjutant Jim Vap said people should offer veterans more than a free meal once a year. He said the government is ignoring the effects of depleted uranium on soldiers in the same way it ignored the effects of agent orange in Vietnam.

Jody Tubbs, service representative with the Kansas Veterans Affairs Commission, said there are benefits available for veterans who fought in older conflicts like the Korean War. Hundreds of thousands of service men and women have been wounded during the war on terror, Tubbs said, and an estimated one third of our veterans from these wars suffer from post-traumatic stress disorder.

I know these are just statistics and they are hard to comprehend," Tubbs said.

The unemployment rate has risen as high as 21 percent among returning veterans, she added. A number of them are living on the street.

"For some it's the coming home," she said, "not the fighting that's the hardest."

When it was his turn to speak, Lewis stressed the need to reach out to anyone they know coming home from an overseas war.

"Just a simple thank you for your service will go a long way to their state of mind," he said.
