

Trailing 6-1 against a Goodland Cowboy who was wrestling more like an animal, Colby junior Jay Zieglemeier could have let his perfect Eagle Invitational record get plowed over.

"He was strong as an ox,"the 195-pounder said about Goodland's Ian Bonsall. "He was a tough, tough wrestler. But (senior) Andrew Taylor gets all of us going, and I wasn't about to stop."

Loyal Eagle fans echoed this attitude with chants of "Jay, Jay, Jay!" through the Colby Community Building.

They had plenty to cheer about as J.Z. closed within 6-4, took Bonsall down for a 6-6 tie and then moved ahead 7-6.

A great comeback for sure, but wait! Bonsall escaped to make it 7-7 and force overtime.

There was no stopping "the ox" now, except someone forgot to tell Ziegelmeier. He went toe-to-toe with this brute for several seconds before finally dropping Bonsall to the mat.

That takedown secured Ziegelmeier's 9-7 decision and perhaps his best victory of the seven-dual tournament.

"All the others were pins," he said. "It was a good weekend."


Indeed. The Eagles won five of seven duals overall as Ziegelmeier, freshman Tate Carney (106) and senior Andrew Taylor posted perfect records.

Other Eagles were close to achieveing this feat: senior David Mainus (113 pounds) lost only match against Pool 1 champion Chapparal. He pinned four other opponents and won a 7-1 decision during his 6-1 weekend (one forfeit win also).

Sophomore Austin Hart powered through his 220-pound pool undefeated before losing only once to Phillipsburg's Luke Jacobs Saturday afternoon.

Junior Kyle Finley delivered a terrific Friday where he defeated four 152-pound foes. Finley pinned a pair and also mixed another dramatic comeback win that's earned him early-season "Cool Comeback" honors.

Unfortunately, Finley suffered a neck injury during his final pool

Finley attended the afternoon matches wearing a brace. Coach Matt Sims was unable to supply more much information because of privacy issues, but said Finley would be further evaluated today.

The Eagles suffered another setback when sophomore Brady Holzmesiter - who scored four tournament wins including three pins — in Saturday's final match with Goodland 152-pounder Ricky Milke.

Chapparal stopped Colby from winning a Pool 1 Invitational title Saturday morning and eventually placed second to Pine Creek. Chapparal defeated Valley Center 7. Hays, 8. Liberal, 9. McPher-40-25 on Saturday.


Colby's last Eagle Invitational title arrived in 2008.
