

1. Three notrump. North's two-diamond bid is basically a game try made in the form of a cuebid in the enemy suit. (It is possible to play this bid as having a different meaning — such as a transfer to hearts — so be sure to discuss this with your partner.) He has at least eight high-card points and is probably short in diamonds. He is likely to have four cards in one or both of the major suits, so you should bid a four-card major if you have one. Typically, partner could have any one of these hands:


