Martha P. Stamm, 80, a Goodland resident, died Sunday, April 23, 2000, at the Goodland Regional Medical Center after being taken there by ambulance.

She was born June 28, 1919, at Fowler, Idaho, the daughter of Anna Elizabeth (Nothdurft) and Joseph Vincint Schield.

Her parents had lived in Cheyenne County before moving to Idaho. They returned to Cheyenne County by train after her birth. She grew up there. She attended school in St. Francis.

She and Gerald Cole were married Sept. 15, 1935. They lived on various farms in Nebraska before moving to a farm north of Edson in January 1954.

She managed the cafes at the Goodland Livestock Sale Barn, the Benkelman, Neb., Sale Barn and the Imperial, Neb., Sale Barn for many years.

She and Forrest Stamm were married Nov. 19, 1976, at Benkelman. They lived there for two years before moving to Goodland in 1978. They spent winters in Arizona.

She was a member of the Emmanuel

Lutheran Church, the County Line Hustlers, a hobby club, and the Elks Does, all of Goodland.

Funeral services will be at 1 p.m. Wednesday at the church with Pastor Scott Grimshaw officiating. Burial will follow in the Goodland Cemetery.

Board OKs 'multiage' idea

port from the other teachers. He said that in a meeting Monday morning, there was not 100 percent support, but he felt part of that was because many of the teachers did not have enough information.

"I like the sound of this," said Ben Duell, board member. "I think when we have teachers who are enthusiastic about such a program, we ought to give them a chance."

Raymer said the first step would be to have another meeting with the teachers at North, and then to have a couple of parent meetings to see if there is interest in the program.

"It there is not enough interest from the parents, it won't happen," Raymer said.

He said the original plan was to have one multigrade classroom with fifth and sixth graders. This would be about 40 students total, he said.

Superintendent Marvin Selby said he thought it was worth pursuing, at least to the point of seeing if there is enough interest among the parents.

"There are a number of items that will need to be worked out, but the first is to see if the interest is there," Selby said.

On a consensus, the board gave

Selby and Raymer permission to pursue the multiage classroom idea, and thanked the teachers for their presentation.

In other business, the board:

- Approved adding new supplemental contracts for the position of girls softball coach (12 percent of base salary), assistant softball coach (7 percent), girls tennis coach (8 percent), assistant tennis coach (5 percent), and assistant debate coach (3 percent). The assistant debate coach would be added retroactive to the beginning of the current school year.

- Approved the hiring of the teaching staff for each building for next year.

- Approved the supplemental contracts for coaching and advisory positions for the next school year.

- By consensus, approved allowing Russell and Selby to establish a committee to look at ways to handle the question of "social promotion" of students, that is, advancing students from grade to grade with their class whether they have mastered the material or not.
