# Royals beat Cleveland 6-1

Tony Muser pulled Chad Durbin with two outs in the ninth, about 25,000 people booed.

Truth be told, Durbin wanted to make it 25,001.

Did he crave a complete-game victory over the same Cleveland team that punished him so terribly in May?

"You look at the big picture, there's nothing disappointing about it," said the Kansas City rookie (2-3), who hadn't won since his major league debut on April 6.

"But I've never thrown into the eighth or ninth inning. Ever. It was disappointing. He told me I'd thrown 130 pitches and to walk off the field and let the crowd acknowledge me."

Ricky Bottalico got the last out as the Royals beat the defending AL Central champions 6-1 just hours after the Indians dealt slugger and RBI leader David Justice to the New York Yan-

Did the trade, coming so soon before the game, throw the Indians off?

"I don't think so," Cleveland manager Charlie Manuel said.

"What happened was we got off slow in the game, got behind. We just didn't get on it."

The Indians pounded Durbin last month for nine runs in just 11-3 innings in a 16-0 rout of the Royals.

"There was a big contrast in the two outings," said Durbin, who was briefly demoted to Triple-A after getting roughed up in the majors.




