After flying back from the Carolinas Wednesday evening, Williams met for about two hours Thursday with athletic director Bob Frederick and Chancellor Robert Hemenway.

Engulfed by reporters as he tried to slip into a side door at Allen Fieldhouse, Williams appeared exhausted. "I am tired," he said.


