

American League wins 6-3

ATLANTA (AP)—Derek Jeter and Chipper Jones would gladly do this all over again in October.

With most of baseball's biggest names out of the lineup because of injuries, the All-Star game Tuesday night turned into another version of Yankees vs. Braves.

And guess which side won? Just like the 1996 and 1999 World Series, Jeter's team wound up on top. The New York shortstop went 3-for-3—as did the Atlanta third baseman—and led the American League to a 6-3 win.

"That really is a shocker. Derek Jeter stealing all the headlines," Jones joked. "It's good to see no one else in the National League can get him out, either."

Joe Torre won again in his managerial matchup with Bobby Cox as the American League took its fourth in a row and 10th in 13 games.

Mark McGwire, Ken Griffey Jr., Barry Bonds and Mike Piazza were missing from the middle of the National League order because of injuries, leaving the game a little short on juice.

Those juiced-up balls that everyone has been talking about were in short

supply, too. While Jones thrilled the home crowd at Turner Field with a home run, there weren't many other long drives.

There were, however, seven foul popups for outs, one of them that American League first baseman Carlos Delgado grabbed before it could almost land in former President Jimmy Carter's lap.

Jeter became the first Yankees player ever to win the All-Star MVP award. After the game, his bat was already on its way to the Hall of Fame.

Jeter hit .353 against the Braves in last year's World Series. Last month, he tied his career high with four hits in a game at Turner Field.

"We played some very important big games here against the Braves, obviously in the postseason, regular season, now this game here," he said.

"Our team has been successful here. Maybe we seem to focus a bit more."

Said Torre: "It's a very, very proud time for the New York Yankees because their future did a good thing tonight."

Jeter and Jones may get another chance to meet in the Fall Classic, rather than the Midsummer Classic—

as both of their teams went into the break in first place.

James Baldwin got the victory and All-Leiter took the loss as the American League cut its overall deficit to 40-30-1. The American League broke open the game with three runs in the ninth, highlighted by Matt Lawton's single.

Jeter, starting because good friend Alex Rodriguez was injured, doubled off Randy Johnson in the first inning, then singled and scored against Kevin Brown in the third. His two-run single in the fourth put the American League ahead 3-1 and came against Leiter in a reprise of last weekend's Subway Series.

"We've been watching that ever since he came to the big leagues," Cox said.

Jones did his best to make the 51,323 fans forget that Cal Ripken, Manny Ramirez and Greg Maddux also were sidelined.

Jones became the 13th player to hit a home run in his own park at an All-Star game, connecting off Baldwin in the third. He also singled twice, one of them off starter David Wells.

The last time the All-Stars visited Atlanta in 1972.

Tar Heels find a new head coach

CHAPEL HILL, N.C. (AP)—Other college coaches promised starting positions and offensive opportunities for Matt Doherty. North Carolina's Dean Smith told the New York prepster he

would be lucky to play by his junior year.

"When coach Smith told me that, I sat up in my chair and I said to myself, 'I'll show you,'" Doherty said.

The 6-foot-8 Doherty did just that, starting as a scrappy sophomore on a national championship team in 1982 with teammates Michael Jordan, James Worthy, Sam Perkins and Jimmy Black.

Doherty again finds himself in an underdog role, this time as the new head coach of the Tar Heels.

The 38-year-old Doherty is part of the North Carolina family coaching tree, but clearly wasn't the first choice to succeed Bill Guthridge.

"I thought that Roy Williams, Eddie Fogler, George Karl or Larry Brown would be here before me," Doherty

said.

Nope. All four turned down or weren't allowed to talk to North Carolina during a 12-day period, leaving Doherty as the top candidate despite only one successful season at Notre Dame.

"Just to be mentioned in the same breath with Roy Williams, Eddie Fogler, George Karl and Larry Brown is very humbling, very humbling," Doherty said late Tuesday night after accepting a six-year contract with the Tar Heels.

"I have not done what those men have done. They have done it for a long time at high levels. I hope to achieve that kind of success here."

Doherty began working on Wall Street out of college, but soon was talked into coaching by Smith.
