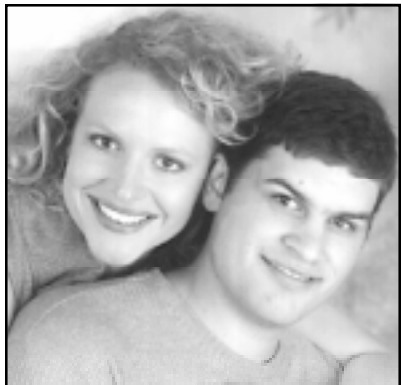

Senator heads to Cuba

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Pat Roberts, R-Kan., plans to travel to Cuba this weekend to meet with Fidel Castro and other officials about ending the 38-year-old embargo on sales of U.S. products.

While Roberts said he is optimistic about forging ties that will last beyond

Castro, 73, he is skeptical that Congress will allow sales of U.S. food and medicine to Cuba this year.

Senate Majority Leader Trent Lott opposes trade with Cuba and says he will try to block an agreement by House Republicans to ease the sanctions.
