Teacher sets fastest qualifying time

Compared to teaching a classroom of second graders, winning the women's 400-meter hurdles at the U.S. Olympic track and field trials was child's play to Sandra Glover.

Glover, who until this year split her time between the track and an elementary school classroom in Sugarland, Texas, made the U.S. team for the Sydney Games with a time of 53.33 seconds Monday that was the fastest in the world this year.

"I had a full-time job and was training at the same time. It was hard," she said. "After working eight hours with 4- and 5-year-olds, it was tough."

Glover's career-best race came on a quiet night at the trials, with just four finals. Melvin Lister won the men's long jump in 27 feet, 3 3/4 inches, the shortest winning mark at the U.S. trials in 20 years; Lynda Blutreich cap tured the women's javelin, and Seilala Sua won the women's discus with a throw of 216-2 that was the longest by an American woman in 14 years.
