

Royals defeated by Tigers

DETROIT (AP) — Bobby Higginson's two-run homer capped a six-run seventh inning as the Detroit Tigers rallied from six runs down to beat the Kansas City Royals 12-9 on Sunday.

Luis Polonia added a bases-loaded triple in the seventh as the Tigers came back from deficits of 4-0 and 9-3 to gain a split in the four-game series.

Gregg Zaun homered in a five-run sixth that gave the Royals a 9-3 lead.

Ausmus, who went 3-for-4 with three RBIs and three runs scored, got one back with his leadoff home run in the sixth.

The Tigers then went ahead in the seventh. Five straight batters reached base with one out, with Damion Easley hitting an RBI double before a walk to Hal Morris loaded the bases. Polonia then tripled to the right-field corner off

Jerry Spradlin.

Tim Byrdak (0-1), who gave up a game-winning grand slam to Jose Macias in the nightcap of Saturday's day-night doubleheader, got Macias to hit a grounder to shortstop Rey Sanchez, who threw Polonia out at the plate.

But Higginson drove an 0-1 pitch over the scoreboard in right-center for his 20th homer and the Tigers' first lead.

Morris hit a two-run double in the eighth off Ricky Bottalico.

Doug Brocail (5-3) pitched one inning for the win. Todd Jones got the last four outs for his AL-leading 27th save in 28 chances.

The Royals scored three unearned runs in the first after third baseman Dean Palmer booted Johnny Damon's leadoff grounder. Two walks also

helped set up Mark Quinn's RBI single, a run-scoring groundout from Todd Dunwoody and Zaun's RBI double.

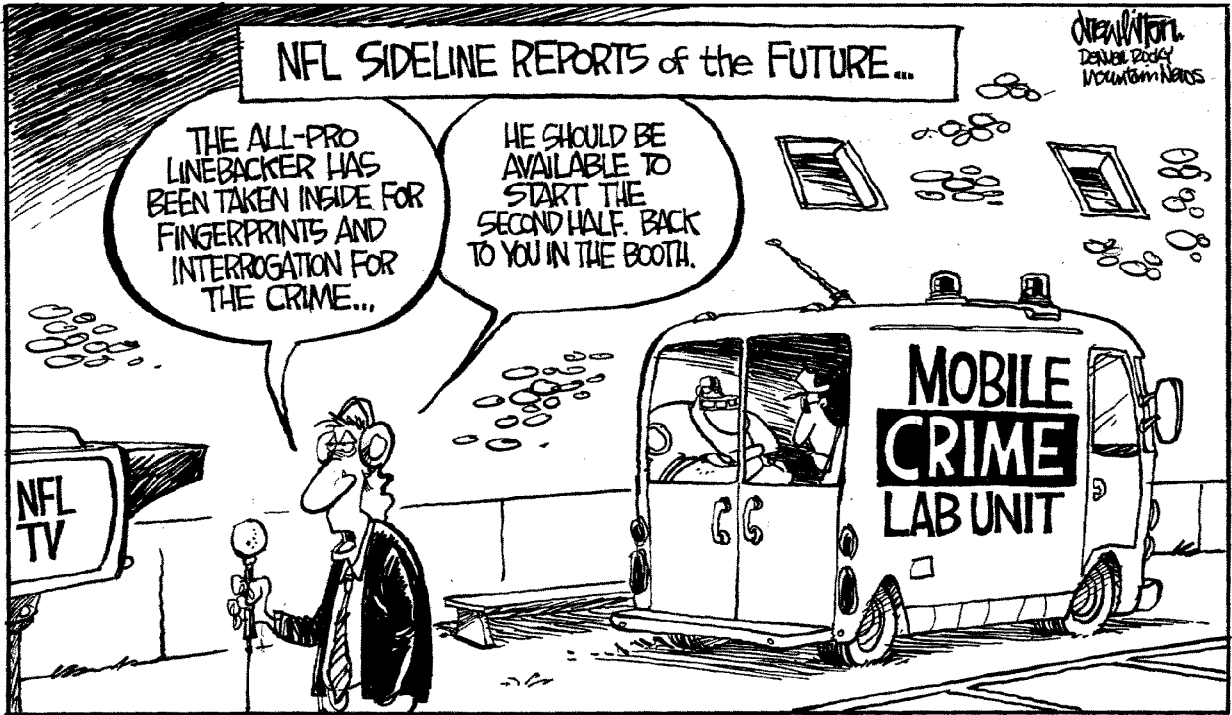
Damon scored Carlos Febles with a double down the right-field line to make it 4-0 in the fourth.

Ausmus cut the deficit in half with a two-run double in the bottom half.

Palmer hit an RBI single in the fifth. The Tigers then loaded the bases with two outs before Juan Encarnacion flew out to the warning track in right-center.

Zaun led off the sixth with his fifth homer, and a sacrifice fly from Sanchez finished Tigers starter Brian Moehler.

Erik Hiljus, just recalled Sunday from Triple-A Toledo, gave up a run-scoring single to Mike Sweeney and back-to-back RBI doubles.



Kansas man out of Olympics

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP) — In the end, Michael Johnson and Maurice Greene talked a lot better than they ran. The great race was a fiasco for the ages. Neither won. Neither even crossed the finish line. First Johnson, then Kansas City, Kansas' Greene pulled up with leg injuries.

Now it's on to Sydney for the U.S. track and field team with a 200-meter squad minus two of the world's fastest men.

"The whole world wanted to see a great show," Greene said. "It's a sad situation that me and Michael didn't finish the race."

Before the not-so-grand finale Sunday, it was a spectacular final day for the U.S. Olympic trials before a sun-baked standing-room-only crowd of 24,072.

• Marion Jones wrapped up her triumphant Sacramento stay by winning the 200 in 21.94 seconds, fastest in the world this year. She also won the trials 100 and long jump, and heads to Sydney on track in her goal to win five gold medals.

• Stacy Dragila, who grew up on a ranch just a 30-minute drive from the stadium, broke her world record in the pole vault by clearing 15 feet, 2 1/4 inches.

• The Clark family finished 1-2-3 in the women's 800 when the eldest of the clan, 37-year-old Joetta Clark-Diggs, somehow lunged into third place at the finish to earn the event's final Olym-

pic berth by one-hundredth of a second.

• Gail Devers, in search of the 100 hurdle gold medal that always has eluded her, broke her American record

with a 12.33 clocking.

Johnson's problems with a cramping right leg Saturday led to speculation that he might pull out.

Rockies fall to Padres in San Diego

DENVER (AP) — Ryan Klesko hit a game-tying solo homer in the ninth and a game-winning two-run shot in the 10th as the San Diego Padres beat the Colorado Rockies 6-4 on Sunday.

Klesko tied the game with one out in the ninth after Neifi Perez gave Colorado the 3-2 lead with his eighth-inning solo homer.

The Padres made it 4-3 on a sacrifice fly by Ben Davis, but Trevor Hoffman (3-4) blew the save when he allowed a sacrifice fly to Brent

Mayne in the bottom half.

Klesko, who finished 3-for-5 with three RBIs, won it in the 10th. Eric Owens reached on an infield single with two outs before Klesko hit a 2-0 pitch from Stan Belinda (1-3) into the Colorado bullpen. It was Klesko's 21st homer of the season and 11th career multihomer game.

Donne Wall earned his first save by pitching a scoreless 10th.

Pedro Astacio took a no-hitter into the seventh for Colorado before ending up with a no-decision.


