land and Dachau, an old German concentration camp. Linda said he told her there is a man who has gone there every day since the war ended to tell visitors that what happened was real and to not forget.

Beeson said her two favorite parts were the National Gallery in London and the Louvre in Paris, which is the largest art museum in the world.

She said she liked “Neuschwanstein,” a castle in Germany. She said Disney modeled their castle replica in their movies after it.

Beeson went on the trip because she wanted to see other parts of the world and how people lived. She said some things were different and others

weren’t. How people dressed was the same, she said, but what they ate was different. Food might have the same name, she said, but when you ordered it, it was different.

Beeson said a funny incident happened in the Paris subway. It was raining, she said, so the group had umbrellas. She was twirling hers on her arm when the string broke and her umbrella went flying onto the subway tracks. She and Diehl were trying to reach the umbrella from above and Diehl even said Beeson could hold her feet while she reached for it.

Some men standing nearby offered to help, but the subway train started coming down the tracks, and the umbrella was lost.

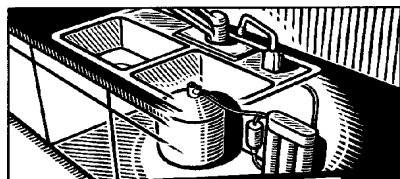

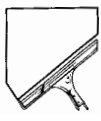
