

# Brewster Homecoming opens football season

## Bulldogs take Coyotes in three quarters, 47-0

The Brewster Bulldogs not only had the first game of the season to be nervous about, but it was the kickoff of the three-day "Homecoming 2000" event.

Not to worry. The No.1-ranked Dawgs' needed only about two and a half quarters to rout the Weskan Coyotes 47-0 in a game that was called because of the 45-point rule.

The Brewster boys were ready to play from the beginning, holding the Weskan Coyotes to one series of downs on their first possession. Clint Horinek scored on the very first offensive play of the year with an 11-yard run. The extra point attempt failed, giving Brewster the 6-0 lead.

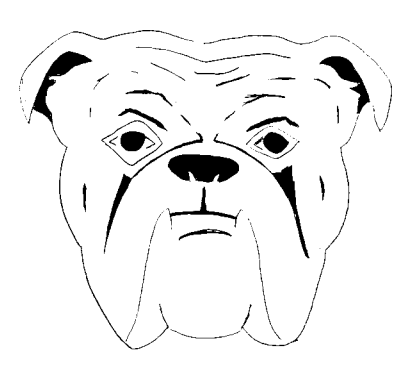
Jay Reid then scored the next touchdown with a 43 yard run, followed by a 2 point conversion pass to Horinek, to put the Bulldogs up 14-0. Horinek added another score with a 1-yard run, but the extra point kick attempt went to the left of the uprights.

Reid threw a shovel pass to Brett Arnberger, who scored on the 35 yard-play to give Brewster a 22-0 lead at the end of the first quarter.

The Dawgs' defense was tough the entire night, with Weskan garnering very few first downs in the contest. The game was played on only half the field in the first half, as the Bulldog's defensive unit held the Coyote's offense to a minimum.

In the second quarter, Reid ran 22 yards to score and kicked the extra point, giving Brewster the lead going into half 33-0. Justin Jamison blocked a field goal attempt by Weskan in the early minutes of the quarter.

At halftime, the crowning of the Homecoming king and queen was the



highlight. Queen candidates were Jill Beiser, Kim Cook and Diane Cranston. King candidates were Brett Arnberger, Clint Horinek and Jay Reid. Arnberger and Beiser were the winners. Jill is the daughter of Greg and Vicky Beiser, and Brett is the son of Rod and Terri Arnberger.

Crown bearers were Megan Bear, daughter of Brandt and Dawn Bear, and John Faber, son of Josh and Rhonda Faber.

The game ended early in the third quarter with Brewster's defense containing the Coyotes.

Reid ran the football 34 yards for his third touchdown of the game, with Arnberger scoring on the conversion with a pass from Reid, making the score 41-0.

Arnberger scored the final touchdown on a 40 yard pass from Reid to make the score 47-0. That brought the game to a close due to the 45 point rule.

Coaches Larry O'Connor and Dick Martoglio and their Bulldogs will travel to Jennings on Friday to take on the Coyotes at 7:30 p.m.

## Chiefs' head coach denies reports he is quitting

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Gunther Cunningham said Tuesday he was not planning to resign as head coach of the Kansas City Chiefs despite reports that he told his players he thought about quitting.

"I'm not planning to resign," Cunningham said Monday at his weekly media luncheon, two days after the season-opening loss to Indianapolis. "Whatever I said with the team is between me and the team

and that's how it's going to stay."

Former Chiefs player Bill Maas, now a TV and radio commentator, said on WHB radio Tuesday morning that Cunningham told players in the wake of Sunday's 27-14 loss to the Colts that he was thinking about resigning until his wife talked him out of it.

Wide receiver Kevin Lockett and several other players later confirmed Maas' report to The Kansas

City Star.

The emotional Cunningham, 54, is beginning his second season as the Chiefs' head coach. Last year the Chiefs were 9-7 and missed the playoffs.

Asked during the question period for broadcasters if the report was accurate, he refused to answer.

"Whether I said it or not is between me and the team and that's how it's going to stay," he said.
